

CONSTITUTION OF THE LEAD TEAM OF GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY

Article I – Name

This organization is to be officially known as Lead Team. However, it may also be referred to as LT or the Lead Team at Georgia State University.

Article II – Purpose Statement

Lead Team is a student organization bringing together students who are interested in developing leadership skills in a team-focused environment. Members are dedicated to the self-growth of each student by organizing and participating in workshops, meaningful events that impact the community, and networking within and beyond Lead Team. We are guided by values of S.E.R.V.I.C.E. which are essential for effective leadership in college and career:

- S- Support
- E- Excellence
- R- Respect
- V- Vision
- I- Integrity
- C- Collaboration
- E- Empowerment

Article III – Affiliation

In partnership with the Leadership Programs Office, Lead Team promotes a culture of leadership development on-campus to ensure that all students are prepared to be effective leaders now and in their careers.

Article IV – Membership Requirements

- A. Candidates must be enrolled as a student of Georgia State University's Atlanta campus to be eligible for membership.
- B. A minimum Georgia State cumulative grade point average of 2.00 is required for membership.
- C. Complete a Lead Team membership form (starting Fall 2020).
- D. Actively support the purpose and values of the organization.
- E. Members are expected to possess the following qualities: a willingness to learn, respect for others, personal maturity, dependability, motivation, initiative, integrity, responsibility, discretion, interpersonal communication skills, and leadership ability.
- F. Members are expected to maintain regular attendance and be punctual.
- G. Honorary members shall have demonstrated outstanding support for the organization.
- H. Honorary members shall have all the privileges of membership except for voting and holding offices.
- I. To be considered active, a member should attend and participate in at least one general meeting and one Lead Team organized campus event each month.
- J. Removal of Membership:
 - 1. Even if a member maintains eligibility for membership, they may be removed from the group due to disruptive or harmful behavior.
 - 2. A member of the Executive Board or an active member may initiate the removal process.
 - 3. The member is given a 14-day notice of intent to withdraw membership. The member is provided an opportunity to address the Executive Board who will review any information regarding the member in question. To continue the removal process, there must be a 2/3 vote of the Executive Board affirming the membership removal.

4. If the Executive Board votes to remove a member, it must be presented for final approval to the general membership at the next scheduled meeting. A 2/3 vote of the general body present at the meeting is required to remove the member.
